- 3. On 3rd December 2015 Inspection by Bangalore University, Standing Committee on Autonomy Review, and a team of eleven members had inspected along with Vice Chancellor, Dr. Prof. B. Thimme Gowda
- 4. On 3rd& 4th March 2016 the UGC Expert Committee, a team of six

members inspected the college for reviewing the function of Autonomy and to grant extension of Autonomous status to evening college for the period of 2016 - 2022.

This is to facilitate the uploading of information pertaining to the Calendar of events, Students attendance, CIA marks, examination time table and various activities organized by the college to the parents guardians and well-wishers. This software keeps them updated on their mobile, email and website. Suggestion Box -A Suggestion Box was installed this year. All grievances and

suggestions of the students are scrutinized. The Principal regularly keeps a tab on such grievances and suggestions and takes corrective measures.

- 76.The College website is updated with the regular calendar of events and various activities.
- 77.Religious activities included the celebration of the feast of St Francis Xavier, retreat for catholic students, first Friday masses, Ash Wednesday mass and Way of the cross for catholic students.
- 78.The Management gave fee concession and scholarship of Rs.10 Lakhs to 304 students, and our benefactors contributed Rs. 2,88,580/- towards the deserving students of our College.
- 79.Sneha Fund contributed Rs. 29,353/- towards the medical expenses of 12 students this year.
- 80.118 students got benefitted from the Evening Snacks Scheme. The College Counselor Ms Miriam Imam coordinates this programme.
- 81. This year placement cell secured employment for 126 students.
- 82. The Department of English, organized one-day UGC sponsored National Conference on "Modern trends in English language teaching; placing the learners in the spot light" on 17th August 2015.
- 83. The Department of Management, organized a one day National Conference on "Emerging Trends in Global Indian Business Scenario" on 27th February 2016.
- 84.Students attended 19 Seminars and made 27 Paper Presentations; and five of them won the Best Paper Presentation award.
- 85.Infrastructure:
- a. UGC funds were fully utilized. This year the following infrastructure work was undertaken:
- b. Principal, Vice Principal, Main Staff Room, Commerce Staff Room and Conference Room were renovated.
- c. Department of English and BCA Staff Rooms were also renovated

- d. Minor painting of Girls Rest Room and Corridors was done.
- e. 16 CCTV cameras were fixed in College campus.
- f. Public Address System was introduced in the College for better administrative communication and daily Prayer.
- g. Medical Room was established with a Full time Nurse on duty.
- h. Laptops, Desktops and tablets and other electronic gadgets were provided to all the departments to enhance the teaching-learning process.
- i. Free Wi-Fi connection for staff.
- j. The Class rooms are equipped with LCD projectors and other amenities.
- k. The campus is Wi-Fi enabled and students have access to toll free internet on their mobiles on all working days between 4.00 to 5.00 pm within the campus only for academic purposes.
- 86.The Institution boasts of vast collection of books and periodicals in its library, spanning a diverse section of disciplines. This academic year 703 books were added to the collection at a cost of Rs. 2,68,973/-. Library has subscribed 29 magazines and 26 newspapers in both English and vernacular languages. The library also has access to online catalogues and libraries such as N LIST, Infilbnet and online access for students and staff in British library.
